







missionary.




Of 1,500 Canadian adults surveyed, 80% were immediately able to name someone whom they consider to be a Canadian hero.

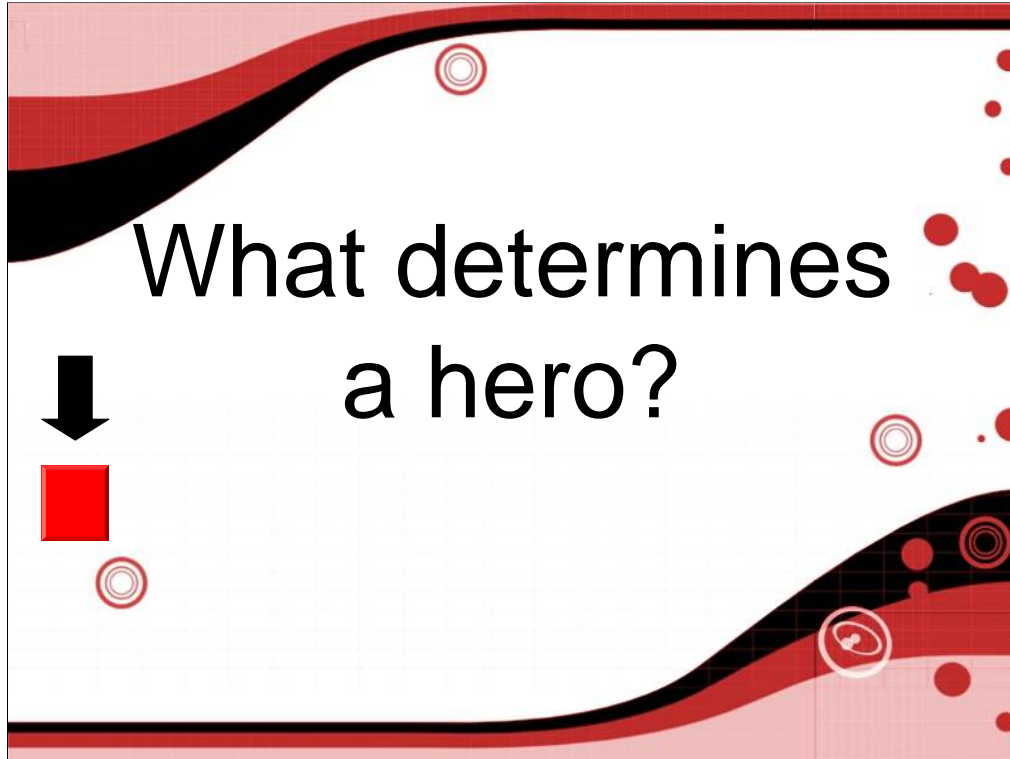

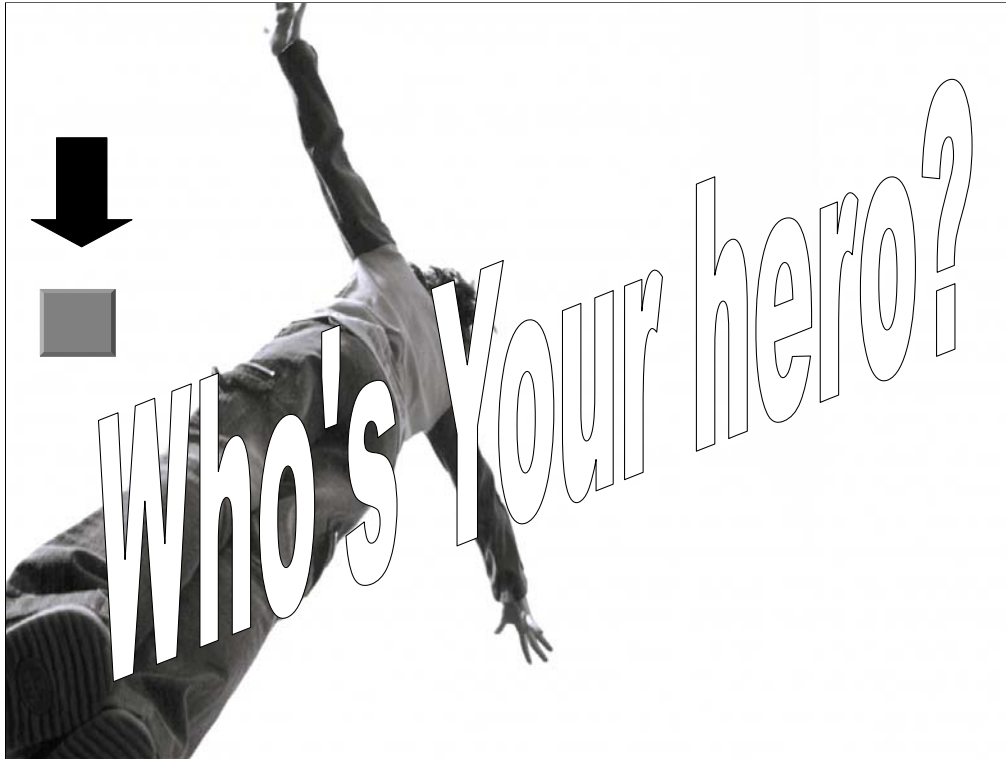
