Aligned for Impact

In 2022, Mission Global concluded a four-year re-imagining exercise that sharpened our strategic focus and laid a fresh foundation for our work in the next decade. 2033 will mark the 2,000th anniversary of the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and His commission to the church to be His witnesses to “everyone, everywhere,” in the power of the Holy Spirit.

The commemoration of this forthcoming anniversary has resulted in unified evangelistic and church planting initiatives by many church and ministry movements. There is an “alignment for mission” to make every effort to provide a credible witness to “everyone, everywhere”; and for our part, we will focus on the 3.2 billion with little or no access to the gospel.

In addition, the Bible makes clear that there will be an increase in war, famine, disease, persecution, and discrimination in our world as we anticipate the Second Coming of Christ. This will result in increased marginalization and vulnerability for many people, particularly for children. Jesus tells us that “...whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me” (Matthew 25:40 NIV).

We are well positioned for **impact** in the next decade as we serve in the establishment of self-sustaining, multiplying church movements and ministries that reflect the compassionate heart of Christ for their communities, their nations, and the world.

Our re-imagining process not only sharpened our focus but also led to increased integration. Our sub-charities – ERDO, RAN, VOH Africa, and RPEC - are all aligned for maximum impact. Together, we will continue to mobilize Canadians to work with our partners around the world to bring a gospel witness to those with little or no access to the Good News. Moreover, we will bring compassionate care to those with little or no access to the basic necessities of life.

Throughout the process, we aligned our new name, **Mission Global**, with Mission Canada, to give greater emphasis to the truth that God is on mission: we must align ourselves to what He is doing in the world. As the Father sent the Son, so also the Son sends us, empowered by His Spirit, to bear witness to the love of God (as referenced in John 20:21).

Eradicating Bible Poverty

The prophet Isaiah wrote, “So is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it” (Isaiah 55:11 NIV). God’s Word is being sent out all over the world, transforming lives for all of eternity!

Throughout 2022, we have been on a mission to eradicate Bible poverty, particularly in such places as Bogota, Colombia and African countries where Villages of Hope Africa (VOHA) is active. In partnership with ShareWord Global, we have been able to hand out over 10,000 Bibles in the heart language of impoverished families in Colombia and 4,800 Bibles to children at VOHA’s safe centres.

Due to your generous giving, so many families and children are now reading God’s Word and being forever changed through the power of the Scriptures! Moreover, they are sharing the Bible with their friends and neighbours, making more disciples of Jesus in the process. The Bible is truly alive and active (Hebrews 4:12), convicting hearts and changing minds!



Spreading God’s Word Far and Wide

Bogota, Colombia

As the capital of Colombia, Bogota is home to over eight million people—many who need Jesus. With global worker Darren McCrea leading, our team knocked on the doors of some of the most impoverished areas of the city.

They handed out Bibles—to the disbelief of many who couldn’t believe that they would give away such a sacred book for free. The team also offered to pray for families who came to the door, touching the hearts of many by their loving concern.

Villages of Hope Africa

Many children come to Villages of Hope centres seeking safety and security. Many of them are without hope, without family, without anyone to love and care for them. Not only does VOHA care for the physical needs of these precious children but their spiritual needs as well.

Over 4,800 children received a Bible; many considered it to be the greatest gift they received, reading it, treasuring it, and sharing what the Bible has to say with their friends.



Planting Communities



Honduras

Jeison is just one of 300 children and teens who attended Hope Camp in Honduras this past summer. Before Hope Camp, Jeison expressed that he wanted to die due to chronic health issues.

God really spoke to Jeison during the camp services. Recently, Jeison shared, “I want to live now: I know that God has more for me.”



Cambodia

In Phnom Penh, Cambodia, over 400 university students are accessing the Global Student Centre that houses a language school, dormitory, church, music school, and drop-in centre.

One of the students, Menghouy, has lived at the centre’s all-female dorm for the past three years, studying to become an architect. She has now encountered Jesus and is ministering at two church plants each weekend.



Israel

In Modi’in, Israel, a new church plant is beginning to grow. A pastor has arrived to shepherd the growing congregation and oversee the small group ministry.

This group of believers has already hosted ten non-believing Jewish families and is preparing to interact with 100 immigrant families through ongoing outreach. Overall, they have already seen 120 families impacted with two people accepting Jesus!



Costa Rica

In La Pera, Costa Rica, 25 people gather each Sunday for worship services in their brand-new church building. Working alongside our global workers, Gary and Kathy Heinrichs, these eight families have a permanent location to begin reaching out to their community.

Moreover, this means that they won’t have to walk long distances or pay for costly transportation to attend a church service in another community.

Ride to Thrive

Supporting Families for Six Months

For Ride to Thrive 2022, we provided much-needed assistance to families and children in Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Myanmar, Ukraine, and Yemen. We distributed emergency food baskets, healthcare supplies, trauma care, and other necessities to thousands in need.

For example, over 190 families in Yemen received emergency food baskets containing staple items such as flour, beans, oil, sugar, and salt. Your support provided them necessary food for a total of six months.

One Yemeni mother, along with her five children, were greatly blessed by these baskets:

Divorced from her husband, Noor* cares for her five children entirely on her own. When she was selected as a beneficiary of these funds, she carefully saved small amounts of money. She was finally able to buy a water tank for her house and even pay off some her debts! She is incredibly grateful to have received so much care and support!

In May 2022, we changed our name from International Missions to **Mission Global**. This was an important next step in our journey that reflects where we have come from and where we are headed. Together, the Holy Spirit is calling us to an incredible future of new vision and growth!

The name **Mission Global** reflects the **beautiful and yet diverse integration** of our donors, churches, charities, global workers, and partners all over the world. We have aligned ourselves with God's mission to reach the world for Christ.

Logo Explanation

Our logo speaks to the “whole truth” as well as our “global work” that is accomplished by the Holy Spirit with energy and movement.

We work in the spaces to bring redemption and reconciliation to the world.



We work in the margins, bringing the gospel to the least reached and most vulnerable.

We work to multiply churches as we make disciples all over the world.



RAN Network

Due to the restriction of sharing the gospel in some areas of the world, **54 workers innovatively reached people for Christ.**

Our workers ministered among some of the least-reached people groups in what is called the 10/40 Window. The majority of these people have little or no access to the gospel.

This past year, we received a report highlighting new believers in North Africa now numbering in the thousands. Less than two years ago, RAN workers established a missional business in a particular country. Today, this business has not only led to the baptism of several new believers, but also the establishment of a house church.

Two RAN workers have experienced a growing ministry in Southeast Asia through their business endeavours, with more RAN workers soon to arrive in that area. RAN workers in Central Asia have been working with refugees fleeing conflict and oppressive regimes, witnessing many coming to faith.

Although we have seen major progress in 2022, we still need more workers to answer God's call to go to the most unreached places on earth. **Please pray for more workers to join us!**



VOH Africa

As a holistic ministry, Villages of Hope Africa (VOHA) cares for over 7,000 vulnerable children in five sub-Saharan countries. **We have ten child-friendly safe centres, offering programs focused on education, healthcare, nutrition, and discipleship.**

VOHA has partnered with Under the Same Sun (UTSS) since 2021. The UTSS focuses on ministering to children with albinism in Tanzania. We have also networked with Keeping Children Safe (KCS) since 2004.

In 2022, KCS organized an online summit: "Child Participation and Safeguarding." During one of the sessions, our VOHA children shared how they participated in child safeguarding at their centres.

In recent years, our VOHA Centres have been launching satellite locations in nearby communities. **Thousands of children come to these satellite locations and our main centres daily.**

We thank God for the opportunity to bring hope to their lives, and we look forward to what He will do in 2023!





ERDO

In 2022, ERDO provided over \$12 million in much-needed aid to children and adults all over the world! **Through your generous support, we cared for more than 530,000 people through numerous crisis response initiatives, community development projects, and ChildCARE Plus sponsorships.**

We are especially grateful to have **distributed food and supplies to over 33,000 Ukrainian families, while providing for 30,000 more Ukrainian refugees in the surrounding countries.** We also assisted over 25,000 people impacted by flooding in Pakistan and Bangladesh.

ERDO helped 87 women in Ethiopia start small businesses, while developing jobs for over 200 people in Kenya. They also fed over 54,000 Zimbabwean children, including those with special needs, each day. And best of all, over 36,000 children responded to the gospel through ChildCARE Plus!

We thank God for what He has done in 2022. ERDO continues to live out its calling as outlined in Isaiah 1:17: **“Do good. Seek justice. Help the oppressed. Defend the orphan. Plead for the widow.”**

GlobalWorks

Launched in 2017, GlobalWorks exists to support kingdom-minded, sustainable missional businesses—especially to the least-reached and most vulnerable places worldwide. Moreover, as Mission Global’s “Business as Mission (BAM)” expression, we believe that **business can be a holistic, innovative means to fulfill the Great Commission.**

It is our joy to equip Canadians to become missionally-focused business owners as they launch and expand their businesses using the “Quadruple Bottom Line” approach. This means that **we focus not solely on profit but also people, creation care, and the gospel.**

In 2022, we saw major growth in our main initiatives:

- **Over 1,100 Canadian business professionals** engaged in BAM Canada events.
- **Over 80 participants** attended our campus ENGAGE events, that highlighted business as an integral means to share the gospel to the least reached.
- **Ten attendees** completed our Business for Transformation (B4T) Incubator, a business start-up program. These individuals have answered the call to establish businesses in eight countries amongst unreached peoples!



GlobalEd

GlobalEd is the equipping arm of Mission Global. Our purpose is to **assist global educators in equipping and raising up leaders for fruitful ministry.**

In 2022, we witnessed your generous support to the Timothy Fund, a scholarship fund that provides students vital support to study at one of our international partner colleges. This past year, the fund grew to \$134,827.20, enabling us to provide 309 Timothy Fund scholarships to students.

Through your continued support of GlobalEd we were able to provide consultation for partners’ strategic planning, board development, financial sustainability, and accreditation initiatives.

One major highlight was **witnessing 16 students from six African countries enrol in our Graduate Certificate in Youth Ministry.** Together, we are making strides to reach the next generation for Christ.

The Ministry Essentials Training Program (METP), a program that equips those who have no access to formal ministry training, is seeing amazing growth. Soon, over 1,000 students will be enrolled in the program!

Providing Ukraine Relief

Because of your generous support, God is transforming the hearts of many in Ukraine!

Pastor Sergei had two choices to make—*escape* to a safer location or *stay*, amidst the danger, in his beloved town where he had been pastoring for over 20 years. His tiny church of 30 had literally dwindled down to half: fifteen of his congregation members had fled their city, Zaporizhzhia, located in southeastern Ukraine.



Forced to do odd jobs just to survive, Pastor Sergei was beginning to wonder where his family's next meal was going to come from. On the verge of leaving, he received a call from one of our workers who asked him, "If we could provide support, including groceries, for you, the church, and your community, would you stay?" Pastor Sergei responded, "Absolutely! We don't want to leave."

Pastor Sergei started distributing groceries all throughout his community. That very Sunday, 46 people attended the service with 15 of them choosing to be baptized in water!

And it gets even better. In just two months' time, Pastor Sergei shared, "I have a good problem. My venue is too small!" After renting a bigger building, that first Sunday in August, Pastor Sergei reported that he baptized 30 out of 170 in attendance!

Pastor Sergei now preaches to a gathering of over 300 people who are eager to learn more about Jesus and be set free by the Spirit. What a testimony of God's faithfulness! Pastor Sergei's church isn't the only one experiencing such tremendous growth. Other Ukrainian churches are growing just as quickly!



Putting into Practice What They Teach

At 90 years, Mrs. Iryna Vikhtynska is the oldest refugee who lives in L'viv Theological Seminary.

Mrs. Vikhtynska escaped the area where she was residing to live at the seminary that has opened its doors to as many Ukrainian refugees as they can.

Half of Mrs. Vikhtynska's house was ruined by Russian missiles. She shares, **"I live in the downtown of the city. It was completely destroyed. The bombing was constant, but I didn't want to leave my home. I left after the third missile strike hit our apartment building."**

Fortunately, Mrs. Vikhtynska received much-needed assistance to make her way to the seminary.

She expresses her gratitude: **"I want to say thank you to all the people who took care of me, gave me food, and provided me shelter."**



Bringing Beauty Out of the Ashes

God is using a warehouse that we partner with to not only provide vital humanitarian assistance to Ukrainians but also to bring about spiritual transformation in their lives.

Since the start of the war, the warehouse located in Poland has distributed over 600 tonnes of food and distributed over one million meals to hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians.

One such person who repeatedly visited our warehouse was Vitaly. As a Ukrainian first responder, he saw the horrors of the war around him. From his own funds, he began to hand out as much food and supplies as he could to children who had lost their parents.

He then began driving regularly to the warehouse to pick up truckloads of food to feed hundreds of orphans.

After constantly interacting with the staff, one day Vitaly burst out, "What is it that you have that I don't?!" Someone then shared the Good News of the gospel with him, and he responded, "I want that." Vitaly's life has now been forever changed!

Offering Living Water

Jesus tells us in Mark 9:41: “Truly I tell you, anyone who gives you a cup of water in my name because you belong to the Messiah will certainly not lose their reward” (NIV).

In accordance with Jesus’ words, ERDO seeks to bring clean water to places like Honduras, Zimbabwe, Kenya, and rural Bangladesh.

In small villages in Bangladesh, most people work as day labourers, traveling to larger cities each morning to find a job for the day. However, **a significant barrier often arises for these individuals.** Since families must travel several hours to collect clean water, they often miss the opportunity to find a job for the day. If they do not collect water, they will return home exhausted at the end of the workday to find they have no water in their house. Since water is necessary for life, they will not have an evening meal or anything to drink.

This is why ERDO launched a campaign called “Million Cups of Water.” Their goal is to raise \$100,000 every year for clean water programs and supply one million cups of water to people in need—all over the world. Furthermore, ERDO has a long history of installing deep tube wells in Bangladesh to keep families from drinking water laced with arsenic and other toxins. **Access to clean water makes a huge difference—cup by cup.**

Jesus also said, “Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, . . . rivers of living water will flow from within them” (John 7:37-38 NIV).

While ERDO responds to the physical needs of rural communities in Bangladesh, Mission Global also works alongside national partners to distribute Bibles, audio Bibles, and other Bible study materials to respond to the spiritual needs of the people.

Bangladesh is beginning to experience a move of God like never before as more people respond to the gospel message and join house churches all across the nation.

They are not only receiving a cup of cold water in Jesus’ Name but the living water that flows from Jesus Himself!

Our Annual Report Update

This report has captured organizational changes, strategic initiatives, successful campaigns, new projects, our brand refresh, and a recognition of the breadth and depth of Mission Global's engagement.

In 2022, many individuals have come to faith, particularly amongst Muslims, and in some of the conflict zones in our world. Ministries focusing on training leaders have experienced exponential growth and leveraged technology to expand the reach. Mobilization of prayer, particularly intercessory prayer for unreached people groups has aligned our hearts with God's, who longs for all to know Him. Greater freedom to travel and meet in person has been embraced by global workers particularly in parts of the world where lockdowns and quarantines were much more severe and stringent than those experienced in Canada.

This freedom has released projects that were on pause, during the volatility of COVID-19, to be re-started. The holistic way that Mission Global workers live and declare the gospel has resulted in many avenues for giving, especially towards ERDO's response to crisis.

For the first time in our history, we reached \$40 million in total revenue in 2022. Your support, especially towards campaigns and crisis appeals, enabled the gospel to go to some of the most vulnerable individuals, even in the face of global economic challenges. Contributions towards relief efforts and emergency response for people in and displaced from Ukraine have helped to meet the physical needs of affected communities and provided access to share the gospel. We celebrate the ability to resume many of the capital projects, building initiatives and new ministry opportunities coming out of COVID-19. We are prayerful that the support of individuals and PAOC churches will continue to fuel Mission Global towards the least reached and most vulnerable of our world in 2023. Thank you for your continued support.

We have great appreciation and admiration for our team – global workers, leadership, and staff. Perseverance in the mission, through volatile and difficult circumstances, has resulted in praise to God who works in all situations.

There is much to celebrate, and we give thanks to God for everyone who plays a part in seeing Christ glorified among the nations.


